### Our Mission

To provide an education to Cambodians and expats that is creative, skills-based, supportive, spiritually aware, and so all-encompassing that every pupil has the chance to discover exactly what ignites them.

The cornerstone of this is the equal importance we give to academic and co-curricular learning. This dual approach opens up a world of possibilities; not only expanding pupils' knowledge and abilities but also instilling independent learning, critical thinking, resilience, and the confidence to explore, choose and self-evaluate.

Our unwavering commitment to strong pastoral care underpins this. We build pupils' self-belief and self-esteem but also their respect and compassion, creating a secure and nurturing environment where individuals value the success of others as well as their own.

This is a rare, if not unique, combination of tradition and modern; of the local and the international, the striving and the compassionate, the academic and the holistic.

The aim is for us to be the school of aspiring choice in Phnom Penh and further afield.

We recruit only fully qualified, experienced international teachers who have a proven track record in allowing children to flourish in all aspects of their development. Our curriculum mirrors that of The King's School, Canterbury, one of the great schools in England. Our Early Years students (ages 2-5) follow the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum together with additional elements such as Khmer teaching and the International Early Years Curriculum. For our Primary students (ages 5-11) we use the English National Curriculum as a backbone together with the International Primary Curriculum (IPC) and elements of the Cambridge Primary Curriculum. For the lower Secondary School, we offer the English National curriculum for KS3 and elements of the Cambridge Lower Secondary Program. From the Early Years to Senior School, we offer Khmer and Chinese lessons delivered by qualified, native teachers. We also have specialist teachers in Art, Music and PE for all Year Groups and from Year 5 upwards all classes are taught by specialists.

In KS4 (Ages 14 to 16) students will study for IGCSE (Cambridge and Oxford AQA boards). In KS5 (Ages 16 to 18) students will study for A Level exams.

## **Charges & Fees**

### **Application Fee (New Students Only)**

**\$100**

(All prospective students must pay a non-refundable fee upon submitting the application form. The cost of the application fee includes the observation and in-school evaluation prior to a formal place being offered.)

### **Admission Test Fee (New Students Only)**

**\$100**

(An admission test fee is non-refundable and must be paid upon submitting the application form.)

### **Refundable Deposit (New Students Only)**

**\$1000**

(This is a one-time charge for new students; it's required to pay this in advance of enrollment to secure a place. Assuming there are no outstanding bills and notice of one term is given prior to withdrawal, this will be refunded to parents in full.)

## **Tuition Fees**

The fees are reviewed annually. The school has 3 terms per academic year. The following are the fees payable for Academic Year 2024-2025, effective from 15<sup>th</sup> August 2024. All fees are billed and payable in USD (\$).

The King's School does not charge a capital levy.

**The King's School term fees are fully inclusive and designed for transparency** such that parents should not expect to pay anything beyond term fees, application fee, admission fee, and deposits. All other curricular, co-curricular, learning materials, consumables, local school trips, equipment needed for study or activities and meals are included in the termly fees. The only exception to this is uniform and more substantial school trips, including international trips.

Fees are payable termly, six weeks in advance of the start of each term and non-refundable once paid.

## **Scholarships**

These are awarded to students who show promise in a broad range of areas including academic, artistic or sporting. The size of scholarship award is discretionary. The award can be withdrawn if the student fails to uphold The King's School values, no longer displays sustained effort and commitment to learning, or seriously breaches the student code of conduct.

## **Founding parent awards**

For the academic years 2023-2025, parents may benefit from financial awards in recognition of their early partnership with The King's School. The size of the award is discretionary and will remain for the whole period that their child is enrolled at The King's School. The award can be withdrawn if the student fails to uphold The King's School values, no longer displays sustained effort and commitment to learning, or seriously breaches the student code of conduct.
